2.	Read 1 Corinthians 12:2 What characterized the Corinthians' past religious life
	when they were still spiritual "Gentiles" steeped in paganism?

3. According to 1 Corinthians 12:3 In contrast to the capricious demonic activity, what does the apostle Paul tell us about the working for the Holy Spirit?

4. What is Paul's "rule of thumb" for discerning the origin of spiritual activity or manifestation? How would you compare this "rule" with 1 Jn 3:4–10 and 4:1–4? How would you apply this rule to a charismatic leader who is a powerful preacher but denies that Jesus is God?

5.	In 1 Corinthians 12:1 Paul moves onto spiritual gifts. Why do you think he is going to talk about this and considering what we know about the life of the Church of Corinth what do you think the reason for addressing this issue?
6.	What do you think the significance of Paul adding the adjective "mute" to describing the idols that they used to follow? Connect this with Ephesians 2:12
7.	What is the common theme amongst chapters 3-10 of this letter and what do you think Paul is going to talk about spiritual things?
8.	Read Romans 12:1-2 and 1 Thessalonians 4:13-14 why is Paul concerned with their ignorance? What type of church is produced when there is rampant ignorance?

9.	Read James 2:18-19 and connect it with this passage. What does it say about the demons and their theology?
