Psalm 137

- By the waters of Babylon,
there we sat down and wept,
when we remembered Zion.
- ² On the willows there
we hung up our lyres.
- ³ For there our captors
required of us songs,
and our tormentors, mirth, saying,
“Sing us one of the songs of Zion!”
- ⁴ How shall we sing the Lord’s song
in a foreign land?
- ⁵ If I forget you, O Jerusalem,
let my right hand forget its skill!
- ⁶ Let my tongue stick to the roof of my mouth,
if I do not remember you,
if I do not set Jerusalem
above my highest joy!
- ⁷ Remember, O Lord, against the Edomites
the day of Jerusalem,
how they said, “Lay it bare, lay it bare,
down to its foundations!”
- ⁸ O daughter of Babylon, doomed to be destroyed,
blessed shall he be who repays you
with what you have done to us!
- ⁹ Blessed shall he be who takes your little ones
and dashes them against the rock!

Why is future judgment something we should find joy in?

1. It **expresses** the **holiness** of God.
2. It **makes unfairness** tolerable.
3. It **releases** you from **seeking** revenge.
4. It **reminds** you, **you** will be judged too.
5. It is the **basis** of the **Gospel**.
