Psalm 142

¹With my voice I cry out to the Lord; with my voice I plead for mercy to the Lord.

²I pour out my complaint before him; I tell my trouble before him.

³ When my spirit faints within me, you know my way!
In the path where I walk they have hidden a trap for me.

⁴Look to the right and see: there is none who takes notice of me; no refuge remains to me; no one cares for my soul.

⁵I cry to you, O Lord; I say, "You are my refuge, my portion in the land of the living."

⁶ Attend to my cry, for I am brought very low! Deliver me from my persecutors, for they are too strong for me!

⁷ Bring me out of prison, that I may give thanks to your name! The righteous will surround me, for you will deal bountifully with me.

What are some takeaways from David's Psalm 142?

- 1. When "the heat is on," you better have your own faith!
- 2. When you feel alone, God <u>never</u> leaves you <u>alone</u>.
- 3. When you pray, pray with **honesty** and **humility**.
- 4. When you pray, acknowledge your **insufficiency** and God's **sufficiency**.
- 5. When you pray, realize it's not to <u>inform</u> God of your situation but to <u>prepare</u> us to receive what He has done for us.
