Psalm 133

- ¹ Behold, how good and pleasant it is when brothers dwell in unity!
- ² It is like the precious oil on the head, running down on the beard, on the beard of Aaron, running down on the collar of his robes!
- ³ It is like the dew of Hermon, which falls on the mountains of Zion! For there the Lord has commanded the blessing, life forevermore.

- 1. <u>Unity</u> is a <u>big deal</u> to God.
- 2. <u>Stop</u> trying to <u>avoid</u> community.

3. <u>Shift</u> out of <u>attack</u> mode.

4. <u>Unity</u> should not be an anomaly, but a <u>norm</u>.
